

The Tree Physiology Lab in the Warnell School of Forestry and Natural Resources at the University of Georgia is seeking a highly motivated person for an M.S. or a PhD starting in August of 2021. Possible research topics include (but are not limited to) tree water storage, drought tolerance, xylem anatomy, impacts of climate change on tree distributions or processes, young tree seedling biology and conifer comparative physiology. There are opportunities to be involved in projects in the piedmont of Georgia, longleaf pine savannas, Rocky Mountain forest systems and other forest ecosystems. The potential student will be funded by a research assistantship, teaching assistantship or combination depending on prospective project.
